TODAY'S MESSAGE • FEBRUARY 20, 2022

Our God Is Far More

EPHESIANS 3:20-21

While it is utterly sinful for us to delight in our glory because we are imperfect and sinful creations, it is totally right for God because He alone is the absolutely perfect, eternal Creator.

And that is why God deserves our worship *“throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen!”* (Ephesians 3:21)

When we really grasp the love of God for us, it changes us to love God and others more so that we can love and forgive the unforgivable and become more like Christ (“the fullness of God,” i.e., spiritual maturity). But if our doctrine or Bible knowledge doesn’t lead us to worship, it leads to a smug self-righteousness that makes us look down on others and have no heart for the unsaved. That’s why Paul ends his prayer for the Ephesians with a doxology. He wants them to worship.

There are seven truths about God and us from this short passage, with the first six in pairs and the seventh providing a fitting conclusion:

1. THE GREATNESS OF GOD:

“Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly...” (Ephesians 3:20)

- In his attempt to capture in human words the incomprehensible, Paul invents a new word from three in the original, “far more abundantly.”

2. THE SMALLNESS OF MAN:

“than all that we ask or think...” (Ephesians 3:20)

- More related perhaps to ignorance than faithlessness, we simply are unable to comprehend the greatness of God even in our wildest imagination.

Implication: This is the God we worship and have. Just when we’ve imagined the limits of God, He lets us know that we’ve again underestimated Him. How can we know what to ask God for? By walking with God, we come to know His will, and when we ask according to His will, He hears us, no matter how outrageous or unimaginable the request may be (1 John 5:14).

3. THE POWER OF GOD:

The Power of the Holy Spirit.

- This limitless power of the Holy Spirit is what Paul asked for in his first prayer in Ephesians 1:18-20: *“that you may know... what is the immeasurable greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His great might that He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places.”*



God’s Way to Heaven

● **THE GOSPEL**

“Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures,” (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)

● **THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD**

God is holy and righteous:

“Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory” (Isaiah 6:3).

He requires holiness of us as well: “Be holy, for I am holy” (1 Peter 1:16).

● **THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST**

Christ is the expression

of God’s love for us: “God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5:8). **Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners:** “For Christ died for sins once for all, righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God (1 Peter 3:18).

Through Christ, God offers man reconciliation: “God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men’s sins against them (2 Corinthians 5:18).

● **WHAT SHOULD WE DO?**

Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior:

If you confess. With your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved” (Romans 10:9).

● **PRAYER:**

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner, I believe that you died on the cross in my place, save me from my sins, and I accept you as my Savior, and the Master of my life forever. Amen.

4. THE HELPLESSNESS OF MAN: God Must Work Within Us, Or Nothing Good Can Happen For Us

Implication: What are a few results of this power of the Holy Spirit in us? It cleanses us from sin and makes us righteous in the sight of a perfectly holy God (Romans 8:1). It has “blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places” (Ephesians 1:3) and “seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus” (Ephesians 2:6). How does God see us now? Justified and glorified! (Romans 8:30).

What is man without God’s Spirit? Strip him of all of the above and sum it up like this: “we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath” (Ephesians 2:3). “But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death” (Romans 6:21).

5. THE PURPOSE OF THE CHURCH: The Church Exists to Exalt God.

“to Him be glory in the church...” (Ephesians 3:21)

- When a church is not intentional in pointing people to God and reminding them that worship is always sacrificial, by the spiritual gravity inherent in human depravity, it will fall into the trap prophesied by 2 Timothy 4:3-4: *“For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths.”*

6. THE PERSONHOOD OF CHRIST: Because Christ is God, the Trinity is Exalted Through Him.

and [to Him be glory] in Christ Jesus...” (Ephesians 3:21)

- If Jesus was a promoted angel or an elevated man, God could never be exalted fully through Him. It would be sacrilegious. Only God can fully glorify God. In the functional relationships within the Triune Godhead, it was decided from eternity past that God would be exalted in and through Jesus Christ.

CONCLUSION

7. THE ETERNAL GLORIOUSNESS OF GOD

One of the greatest theologians in history, Jonathan Edwards, argued that it would be wrong for God not to delight fully in what is gloriously beautiful and worthy of delight – in Himself and His perfection. While it is utterly sinful for us to delight in our glory because we are imperfect and sinful creations, it is totally right for God because He alone is the absolutely perfect, eternal Creator. And that is why God deserves our worship *“throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen!”* (Ephesians 3:21)
