TODAY'S MESSAGE • FEBRUARY 27, 2022

What God Expects From His Family

EPHESIANS 4:1-3

People empowered by God and loved by God shouldn't be fighting inside the family of God. Yet most of us have sadly witnessed how destructive division in churches can be. That's why the most important request of Paul towers above everything else:

Having been loved and empowered like this, let's walk worthy of our calling, and be united in Christ. That's what God expects from His family.

Given a church with saved members who are faithful to the Gospel and the basic doctrines of the faith: the most basic foundation of that church is its unity. That also means that the most destructive weapon of Satan against any church is division.

That's why after praying for God's love and power to become real to the Ephesians, Paul makes a powerful appeal about their being united and never divided. That's exactly what God also expects from our own church family, corporately and individually:

1. THE <u>REASONABLE APPEAL</u> FOR UNITY: Let's walk in a manner worthy of our calling. (Ephesians 4:1)

- A personal appeal (Romans 12:1): I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you...
- A Biblical appeal (Ephesians 1:3-4): walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called (Salvation).

2. THE <u>RELATIONAL ATTITUDES</u> FOR UNITY. (Ephesians 4:2-3a)

These relational attitudes are required attitudes for a church to worship together and serve together in joyful unity. If we do not exercise these towards each other, our division and eventual destruction as a church is practically guaranteed:

a. Humility and Gentleness

Because of how they are put together in the original and also to aid recall, we combine humility and gentleness as one relational attitude. In reality, gentleness can only arise from genuine humility. "Humility, the most foundational Christian virtue (James 4:6), is the quality of character commanded in the first beatitude (Matthew 5:3) and describes the noble grace of Christ (Philippians 2:7, 8)." J.M. Macarthur

- b. Patience (lit. "suffering long")
- c. Putting up with each other in love (transliteration)
- d. Passion for unity

The phrase "eager to maintain" in Greek is not just normal eagerness or desire; it is better described as "zeal, diligence, or passion."

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God's Way to Heaven

THE GOSPEL

"Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures," (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)

THE TRUTH ABOUT GOD

God is holy and righteous: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty, the whole earth is full of his glory" (Isaiah 6:3). He requires holiness of us as well: "Be holy, for I am holy" (1 Peter 1:16).

THE TRUTH ABOUT CHRIST

Christ is the expression of God's love for us: "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5:8). Christ paid the penalty of our sins and died for sinners: "For Christ died for sins once for all, righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God (1 Peter 3:18). **Through Christ, God offers** man reconciliation: "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them (2 Corinthians 5:18).

WHAT SHOULD WE DO? Believe and receive Jesus as Lord and Savior:

If you confess. With your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9).

• PRAYER:

Lord Jesus, be merciful to me, a sinner. I believe that You are the Son of God who took the penalty for my sins on the Cross. I humbly ask You to be my Savior and submit to you as my LORD forever. Amen.

Note that the practice of these four attitudes is sacrificial! They don't come easy because you must be willing to often bear the unbearable. Yet these are all part of the fruit of the Spirit which is in every believer (Galatians 5:22-23). We are set up to succeed, not fail, personally and as a church.

3. THE <u>RESULTING ACTION</u> FOR UNITY. (Ephesians 4:3b)

- Applying these relational attitudes towards each other in our church family will result in peace. That gives us the unity of the Spirit.
- This is not a call to *create* unity; it is a warning to *maintain* the unity God achieved in Christ (Ephesians 2:11–22).

 The Spirit brings the *bond of peace*. However, that can be disrupted by arrogance, falsehood, pride, and selfish assertiveness.

FINAL THOUGHTS

People empowered by God and loved by God shouldn't be fighting inside the family of God. Yet most of us have sadly witnessed how destructive division in churches can be. That's why the most important request of Paul towers above everything else: Having been loved and empowered like this, let's walk worthy of our calling, and be united in Christ. That's what God expects from His family.





Before He ascended to heaven, our Lord Jesus promised to the believers: But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

GCF Family, this promise is still true for us today. All true believers are indwelled by the Holy Spirit. And so, we have the same unlimited power of the Holy Spirit, the same power that raised Jesus to life and seated Him at God's right hand in the heavenly places. For what purpose? So that you and I will be Christ's witnesses in our Jerusalem, the communities around GCF, and in all Judea and Samaria, or the surrounding cities around Pasig, and to the end of the earth.

How would you like to experience the Holy Spirit's power working through us as we witness and reach out to the communities around us? Allow me to share with you three simple ways.

First, WAIT on the Lord!

We will be forming community prayer groups from among GCFers who live in condo communities around GCF. Together with your GCF family co-residents, you will be gathering together regularly to pray for your condo community. Your community prayer groups will be asking God to open up opportunities to share His love to your neighbors and oikoses such as your condo admin and personnel.

Second, WATCH how the Lord is at work.

Jesus said in John 5:19 "the Son can do nothing of his own accord, but only what he sees the Father doing. For whatever the Father does, that the Son does likewise. As God's children, we will follow Jesus' example of watching where our Father is at work so we can join His work of transforming lives and communities through Jesus Christ.

Third, WORK.

When God reveals where He is at work, then you will join Him in His work. How? However, the Lord wants us to! It can be sharing the gospel to your neighbor who lives across your unit who suddenly asks you about our faith. Or your community prayer group may organize a talk on relevant issues such as mental health issues. Or perhaps through sports and physical wellness activities.




